### Let's Pretend Play!

By the age of two, kids begin to engage in imaginative play. Pretend play fosters a child's sense of curiosity and creativity, plus it encourages language development and life skills. Spark pretend play by:

- Offering a prop box filled with a variety of dress-up clothes, kitchen utensils, blankets and pieces of material, old phones, empty boxes, blocks, toy cars, dolls, stuffed animals, and a mirror.
- **Play along** by following their lead and building on their ideas. Playing birthday party? Use a block as the cake, sing the Happy Birthday song and pretend to blow out candles, then cut and eat the cake.
- **Practice and explore** new situations that might be hard or scary like starting a new school, going to the doctor, or to a sleepover.
- More pretend play ideas:

Host a tea party with stuffed animals and dolls. Go on a camping trip. Visit Grandma. Ride a bus. Go shopping. Cook a meal. Plant a garden. Work at the Post Office. Play superheroes. Be a veterinarian. Act like animals in the zoo. Voyage by airplane.
