The Importance of Scribbling

Scribbling is an early handwriting skill. Encourage interest by providing your child with lots of opportunities to scribble, draw, and 'write.'

- Keep plenty of paper and chunky crayons handy.
- Model drawing straight lines and circles.
- Offer opportunities to draw in sand, mud, shaving cream, cornmeal, or pudding.
- Build hand strength with pinching and squeezing activities such as playing with playdough, building with blocks, and moving items (like cotton balls) with tongs or tweezers.

Knowing that more formal handwriting will be taught later in school, praise early efforts by posting their work on the refrigerator or wall, or take photos and share them with other family members!

Dancing on my shoulders(touch shoulders)Dancing on my head(touch head)Dancing on my knees(touch knees)


Now tuck him into bed (hide thumb behind your back)
