### Fun with ABCs

Practice the alphabet with these fun and easy activities.

- **Sensory ABC bags** – Loosely fill a gallon-size Ziploc bag with uncooked rice. Add in magnetic letters, Scrabble tiles, or letters written on cardboard and seal it shut. Shake the bag and have your child find the letters. Once they find a letter, have them write it down, or mark it off on a printout of the alphabet. Continue until they find the whole alphabet. For younger children use 4-5 capital letters at a time.
- **Highlight Letters** – Use a magazine, newspaper, or printout for this search game. Give your child a highlighter and ask them to mark as many specific letters as they can find. Example: There are five M's in these two sentences.
- **Magnetic Match** – Write the letters of the alphabet on a cookie sheet using a permanent marker. Have your child practice matching a magnetic letter with the same letter on the cookie sheet. (When finished, the marker will erase easily with hand sanitizer and the scratchy side of a sponge.)
